The Court Injunction

The Seidls filed their lawsuit against the WIAA in August 2025.

On September 5, 2025, Judge Paul Bugenhagen Jr. issued a temporary injunction preventing the WIAA from stopping Seidl from playing varsity football during the 2025 season while the case proceeded.

Seidl subsequently played for Arrowhead during the season. Arrowhead finished 13–1 and defeated Bay Port 18–15 at Camp Randall Stadium on November 21, 2025, to win the WIAA Division 1 state championship.

What Happened to the Lawsuit in 2026?

The case continued after the football season ended.

In July 2026, Judge Bugenhagen determined that the case had become moot because Seidl's senior season had ended and he had graduated. The temporary injunction was dissolved, and the case was dismissed.

Importantly, the dismissal did not itself impose a sanction on Arrowhead or automatically remove the team's championship. According to Law Suit Wiki's September 2026 review, the WIAA had not publicly announced a sanction against Arrowhead at that point.

Therefore, claims that the Arrowhead title had already been stripped should be treated cautiously unless supported by a subsequent official WIAA announcement.
